NOW DIG THIS: The Unspeakable Writings of Terry Southern, 1950-1995 (Grove Press) is a collection of works

by this bold and ground-breaking American original. Featured here are interviews, early short stories, accounts of his experiences as the Rolling Stones' court reporter, his hilarious unpublished expose on the Cuban invasion, and "Wormball Man", an outrageous satire on capital punishment--as well as intimate, at times scandalous portraits of Abbie Hoffman, Staley Kubrick, Kurt Vonnegut, Jr., and the "Quality Lit" crowd. Also included is Southern's Esquire article about the 1968 National Democratic Convention, where he was a pivotal figure in the riots and a key witness in the trial of the Chicago 7, and how reading Poe at the Dallas Public Library in 1936 launched his career in writing satire. Southern has long been considered the godfather of the Beats, a forerunner of New Journalism, and one of America's most hilarious and innovative writers.
